Do injustices end without accountability?



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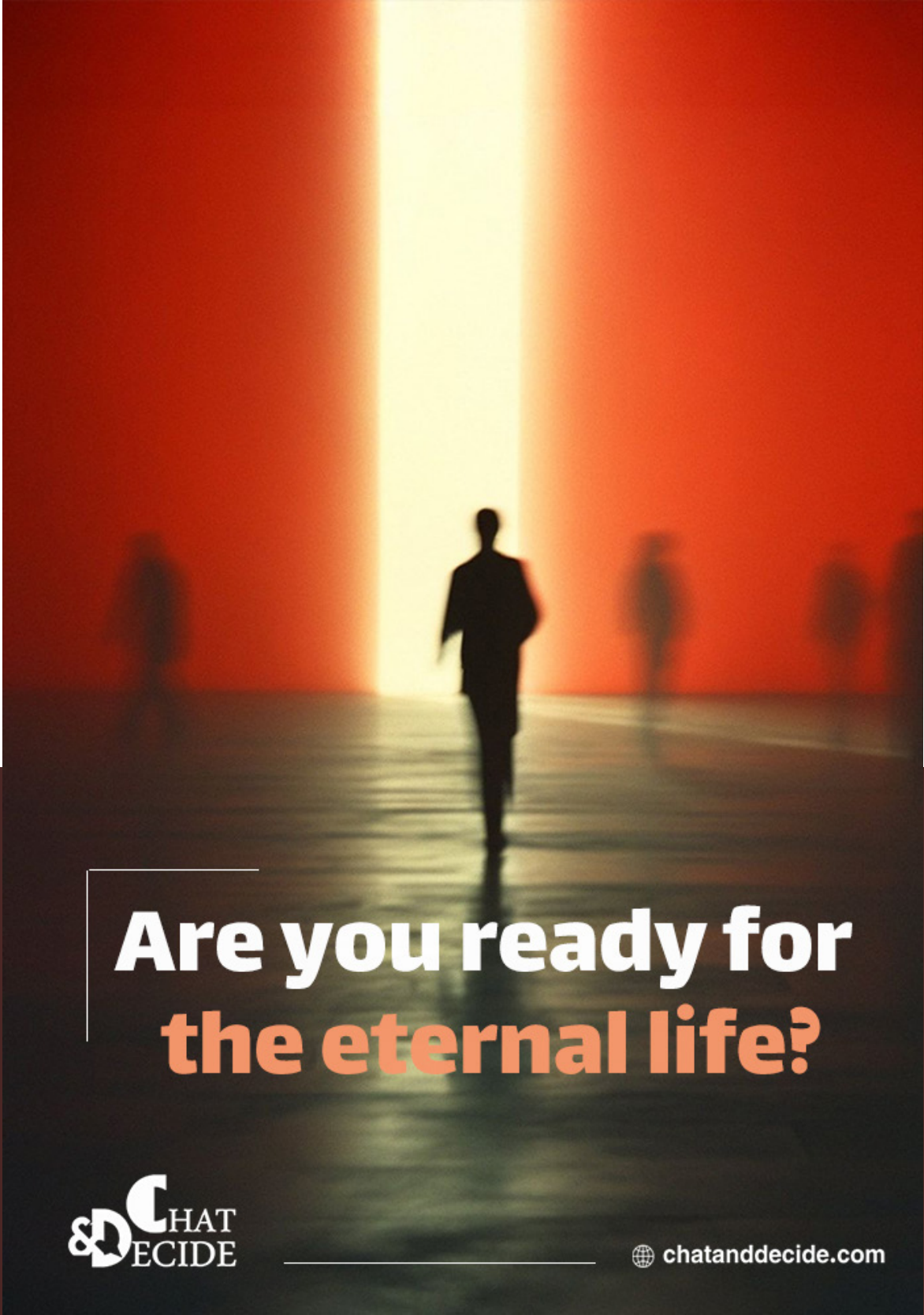
Do injustices end without accountability?

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Do you think the grave is the end?


Your life is a short journey that begins in the mother's womb and ends at the grave...

So, have you prepared your provisions for that stage?


The grave is the first abode of the Hereafter, so begin your preparation today.
